**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) for Engagement of Animal Welfare Organisation(s) for  
Animal Birth Control (ABC), Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV), Rescue, Treatment,  
Rehabilitation and Veterinary Services for Animals and Birds at IISc Bangalore**

## **1. Invitation for Proposals**

The Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru invites sealed proposals from eligible and experienced Animal Welfare Organisations (AWOs), NGOs, veterinary institutions, or other eligible entities registered under applicable laws for providing comprehensive animal welfare and veterinary services at the IISc Campus, Bangalore . The scope includes as below:

- (a) **Animal Birth Control (ABC) and Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV)** for stray dogs, in accordance with the Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023 vide G.S.R 193(E) dated 10th March, 2023. This shall cover activities such as catching, controlling population through sterilization, vaccination, de-worming, post-operative care, and safe release of dogs.
- (b) Humane euthanasia of stray dogs that are found to be critically ill, rabid, or dangerous, as per applicable animal welfare guidelines / Supreme Court directions.
- (c) Provision of veterinary care for cats, including vaccinations and treatment of injuries or illnesses.
- (d) Safe rescue and management of snakes and monkeys from the campus to designated safe zones in coordination with GBA / Karnataka Forest Department.
- (e) Treatment and care of injured or distressed animals and birds found within the campus.
- (f) Promote peaceful coexistence between the campus community and animals / birds.

Proposals should comprehensively address all components listed above as part of an integrated and humane animal welfare initiative.

The selected agency/agencies shall provide comprehensive animal management services at the campus in compliance with:

- The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960;
- Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023;
- Applicable GBA/Karnataka Government notifications;
- Directions and Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) issued by the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI);
- Latest judgements and directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India relating to management of stray dogs including regulated relocation and sheltering of dogs from sensitive institutional areas and public safety.

## **2. Scope of Work**

The selected agency shall provide end-to-end services including but not limited to the following:

### **2.1 Animal Census & Identification**

- Conduct baseline survey and census of:
  - Stray Dogs;
  - Cats;
  - Monkeys;
  - Birds requiring intervention;
  - Other animals found within campus, if required.

- Geo-tagging and identification records, if required.
- Ear-notching/microchipping/tagging as applicable.
- Maintenance of digital database.

## **2.2 Animal Birth Control (ABC)**

- Humane capture of animals deploying trained catchers using humane methods and tools.
- Sterilisation surgeries in accordance with ABC Rules, 2023.
- Pre-operative and post-operative care.
- Recovery and monitoring.
- Maintenance of surgery records.

The agency must possess valid authorization/project recognition for conducting ABC programmes under applicable law.

## **2.3 Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV)**

- Mass anti-rabies vaccination programme.
- Annual booster vaccination.
- Maintenance of vaccination records.
- Emergency vaccination response during bite incidents.

## **2.4 Rescue & Emergency Response**

24x7 or defined-hour rescue services for:

- Injured animals;
- Sick animals;
- Aggressive animals;
- Suspected rabid animals;
- Animals trapped in infrastructure;
- Bird rescue and treatment.

Maximum response time:

- Emergency cases: within 1–2 hours;
- Routine complaints: within 24 hours.

## **2.5 Treatment & Veterinary Care**

- On-campus veterinary OPD/visits.
- Treatment of injured and diseased animals.
- Diagnostic support.
- Euthanasia strictly in accordance with law and veterinary certification.

## **2.6 Shelter, Rehabilitation & Relocation**

The selected agency shall:

- Provide access to recognized shelter infrastructure;
- Shift animals requiring isolation, observation, rehabilitation or long-term care;
- Relocate aggressive, rabid, terminally ill or campus-incompatible dogs to legally compliant shelters/rehabilitation centres;

- Ensure humane transport and shelter standards.

The agency shall comply with current directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court remove dogs from sensitive institutional premises where necessary for public safety and institutional functioning.

No relocation or release shall be undertaken contrary to prevailing statutory requirements, court orders, AWBI SOPs or directions issued by competent authorities.

## **2.7 Bird Welfare Services**

- Rescue and treatment of injured birds;
- Nest relocation where unavoidable;
- Coordination during tree pruning/campus construction activities;
- Emergency avian care.
- Use of trained avian handlers.

## **2.8 Complaint Management System and coordination**

- Dedicated helpline/mobile number/email;
- Complaint registration system;
- Incident reporting dashboard;
- Monthly analytics and reporting.
- Coordination with Security Office /

## **2.9 Awareness & Training**

Conduct periodic awareness programmes on:

- Rabies prevention;
- Animal behaviour;
- Humane coexistence;
- Bite prevention;
- Emergency reporting protocol.

## **3. Preliminary Requirements**

Interested bidders must meet the following preliminary eligibility criteria to qualify for technical and financial evaluation.

### **3.1 Eligibility Criteria**

Bidders must meet the following eligibility conditions to participate in this tender:

#### **(a) Legal Status**

The bidder must be a legally registered entity in India, such as a Trust, Society, Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), or Private Limited Company, engaged in animal welfare or veterinary services.

#### **(b) Recognition**

The bidder must be recognized by the **Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI)** / State Authorities / GBA

**(c) Experience**

The bidder must have a **minimum of three (3) years of experience** in conducting Animal Birth Control (ABC), Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV) programs, and providing rescue and treatment services for stray animals, snakes and birds.

**(d) Past Performance**

The bidder must have successfully completed **at least two (2) similar projects** for a government agency, university, or large institutional campus.

**(e) Veterinary Personnel and vehicle**

The bidder must have qualified veterinary doctors, para-veterinary staff, dog handlers, rescue vehicle etc., for managing the Institute's requirements.

**(f) Infrastructure**

The bidder must have access to or operate a **licensed ABC facility or veterinary hospital or animal shelter** equipped with:

- (i) An operation theatre
- (ii) A recovery area
- (iii) A post-operative care unit
- (iv) Fully functional animal shelter / rehabilitation facility
- (v) Quarantine / Isolation facilities

The bidder should have Registered Office or Branch Office with full infrastructure in Bangalore.

**(g) Regulatory Compliance**

The bidder must be in compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and guidelines, including but not limited to:

- (i) The **Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act**
- (ii) **AWBI guidelines**
- (iii) **Karnataka Municipalities ABC Rules**, where applicable

**(h) Litigation and Blacklisting**

The bidder must **not be blacklisted** or involved in any ongoing litigation with any government, municipal body, or public institution.

**(i) General Terms and Conditions**

- (a)** All activities shall comply with:
- (i) The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act.

- (ii) Wildlife Protection Act .
- (iii) AWBI and Karnataka State Guidelines.
- (iv) Applicable Forest Department and Municipal norms.
- (v) Latest Supreme Court directions/orders concerning stray dog management in institutional/public premises.
- (b) Emergency medical care must be available 24x7.
- (c) IISc will not be responsible for any damage/injury sustained by staff deployed by the bidder.
- (d) All permits, licenses, and clearances are the bidder's responsibility.
- (e) IISc retains all rights to data, reports, and documentation generated.
- (f) Regular inspections and performance monitoring will be conducted.
- (g) Agency must submit weekly and quarterly reports, including images.
- (h) IISc reserves the right to terminate the contract with 30-day notice for non-performance or violation of terms.
- (i) Payment shall be milestone-based upon submission of deliverables and verification by IISc.
- (j) All disputes are subject to the jurisdiction of Bengaluru courts

#### 4. General Terms and Conditions

- (a) The contract will be valid for a period of **3 years** from the date of award renewable on yearly basis. The contract may be extended after completion of each year based on mutual consent and satisfactory performance.
- (b) The selected agency shall carry out the scope of work as per AWBI and Karnataka state regulations and the agency must comply with:
  - (i) The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act.
  - (ii) Wildlife Protection Act
  - (iii) AWBI Guidelines and Karnataka State Guidelines.
  - (iv) Applicable Forest Department and Municipal norms.
  - (v) Latest Supreme Court directions/orders concerning stray dog management in institutional/public premises.
- (c) All permits/licenses for handling animals, surgeries, and transportation must be maintained. All permits, licenses, and clearances are the bidder's responsibility.
- (d) The agency shall deploy sufficient trained personnel, including licensed veterinarians and support staff. All equipment used must be in good condition and suitable for humane operations. IISc will not be responsible for any damage/injury sustained by staff.
- (e) The agency shall take all precautions to ensure the **safety of the animals, personnel, and the public**. Emergency protocols must be in place in case of accidents or health complications. Emergency medical care must be available 24x7.
- (f) IISc retains all rights to data, reports, and documentation generated during this project. The agency shall not share or publish the information without prior written consent.
- (g) **Payments will be made as per the commercial bid and milestones defined to successfully bidder. Payment is subject to verification of deliverables and approval by IISc.**
- (h) IISc reserves the right to terminate the contract with **30 days' notice** in case of:
  - (i) Non-performance or breach of contract
  - (ii) Misconduct or non-compliance with guidelines
  - (iii) Any act endangering the welfare of animals or public
- (i) IISc shall not be liable for any failure to perform its obligations under the contract due to unforeseen circumstances beyond control (e.g., natural disasters, pandemics, legal

- prohibitions).
- (j) Any disputes shall be resolved amicably. If unresolved, jurisdiction shall lie with the courts of **Bengaluru, Karnataka**.
  - (k) The agency must maintain confidentiality of all institutional data, survey results, and internal communications related to the program.
  - (l) The proposal should be completed in all respects.
  - (m) The proposal shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the date of its opening.
  - (n) The proposal and cover should bear the name and address of the Bidder/Franchisees, and all documents should bear their seal and signature.
  - (o) The Institute reserves the right to accept or reject any or all the proposals wholly or partly without assigning any reason thereof.
  - (p) On all matters pertaining to this contract, the decision of the Director of the Institute shall be final and binding.
  - (q) Any disputes arising out of this tender shall be settled by mutual negotiation. The courts at Bangalore shall have exclusive jurisdiction over this tender in the event such a settlement cannot be reached.
  - (r) In technical evaluation, the institute reserves the right to verify the technical specifications through various sources including the submitted brochure, company website, etc. Inconsistency or ambiguity in information may lead to disqualification. Feedback of the existing vendors from the Institute Community will also be taken into consideration. In case of any negative feedback from Institute Community, institute reserves the right to summarily reject the bid during technical evaluation without any further clarification.
  - (s) The agency shall maintain adequate insurance coverage, including Professional Liability Insurance and insurance covering personnel deployed under the contract. Proof of insurance shall be submitted before commencement of work.
  - (t) The successful bidder shall furnish a Performance Security Deposit equivalent to 5% of the annual contract value in the form of Bank Guarantee or Demand Draft within 15 days of issue of Letter of Award. The Performance Security shall remain valid throughout the contract period and may be forfeited in the event of breach of contract.
  - (u) The agency shall indemnify and keep indemnified IISc, its officers, employees and representatives against all claims, damages, losses, liabilities, penalties, legal proceedings and expenses arising out of negligence, misconduct, non-compliance with statutory provisions, injury to persons, animal welfare violations or breach of contract by the agency.
  - (v) IISc reserves the right to seek replacement of any veterinarian, animal handler or staff member whose performance is found unsatisfactory or whose conduct is detrimental to the interests of the Institute.
  - (w) The agency shall attend monthly review meetings convened by IISc and submit performance reports, complaint statistics, vaccination records, rescue records and rehabilitation details.
  - (x) IISc reserves the right to inspect the shelter, rehabilitation centre, ABC facility and related infrastructure at any time without prior notice.
  - (y) The agency shall nominate a dedicated Nodal Officer available on telephone at all times for coordination with IISc Security Office.
  - (z) The agency shall maintain digital records of every animal handled including photographs, GPS location, treatment records, vaccination details, sterilization details and final disposition.( if possible)
  - (aa) The agency shall comply with all future directions, notifications, judgments, guidelines, SOPs or orders issued by the Government of India, State Government, AWBI, GBA, competent authorities and Courts during the currency of the contract.
  - (bb) The agency shall disclose any conflict of interest that may affect performance of the contract. Failure to disclose such conflict shall result in termination.

- (cc) The agency shall comply with all applicable labour laws, taxation laws, professional tax, EPF, ESI (where applicable), and any other statutory requirements relating to personnel deployed under the contract.
- (dd) The agency shall not disclose any information relating to IISc operations, security arrangements, campus maps, research facilities or sensitive institutional information obtained during execution of the contract.
- (ee) Prospective bidders are advised to visit the IISc campus and familiarize themselves with the site conditions before submission of bids. No claim arising out of lack of site knowledge shall be entertained subsequently.
- (ff) The agency shall investigate all reported animal bite incidents and submit a detailed report to IISc within 48 hours.

## 5. Mode of furnishing the Proposal

Interested bidders shall submit the proposal in TWO BID system in two separate sealed covers. The first cover or **COVER 'A'** (Annexure-1) should contain technical details, and second cover or **COVER B** should contain commercial bid. Both cover 'A' and cover 'B' should be kept in a bigger cover and super scribed as “**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) for Engagement of Animal Welfare Organisation(s) for Animal Birth Control (ABC), Anti-Rabies Vaccination (ARV), Rescue, Treatment, Rehabilitation and Veterinary Services for Animals and Birds at IISc Bangalore**”.

An EMD of Rs. 18,000/- in the form of Demand Draft drawn in favour of “The Registrar” Indian Institute of science, Bangalore.

**COVER A** should have the following documents:

Interested bidders shall submit the proposal in the prescribed format along with the following documents.

- (j) **Approach & Methodology Document** – Plan for capturing, sterilization, vaccination, post-op care, and community sensitization.
- (k) **Timeline & Work Plan** – Estimated project schedule.
- (l) **Compliance Declarations:**
  - (i) Not blacklisted by any government/institution.
  - (ii) Willingness to follow AWBI and Karnataka rules.
- (m) **Photographs of ABC Operations** (optional but encouraged).
- (n) **Any Other Supporting Documents** the bidder wishes to include.

The evaluation of the technical proposal will be carried out by a Sub Committee without accessing the financial part of the proposal.

Only those bidders who qualify in the Technical Bid evaluation (Cover A) will be considered for financial evaluation (Cover B).

- (a) Commercial bids of technically qualified bidders will be opened.
- (b) The bidder quoting the **lowest total cost (L1)** for the entire scope of work shall be selected, **subject to price reasonableness**.
- (c) IISc reserves the right to negotiate or reject any or all bids.
