Section 2 – Eligibility Criteria

Prequalification criteria:

1. The Bidder's firm should have existed for a minimum of 5 years. (Enclose Company Registration Certificate)
2. The bidder must have supplied similar equipment to Centrally Funded Technical Institutes (CFTIs) and/or Central/State Universities in the last two (2) years. User testimonials, contact details, and proof of supply (PO or letter from the user) shall be furnished. IISc reserves the right to independently verify the machine performance with the users, where the bidder has previously supplied.
3. The Bidder should belong to either class 1 or class 2 suppliers, distinguished by their "local content" as defined by recent edits to GFR. They should mention clearly which class they belong to in the cover letter
 - a) Class 1 supplier: Goods and services should have local content of equal to or more than 50%.
 - b) Class 2 supplier: Goods and services should have local content of equal to or more than 20 % and less than 50%.
4. Purchase preference, as defined by the recent edits to GFR (within the "margin of purchase preference") will be given to the Class-1 supplier.
5. The bidder should sign and submit the declaration for Acceptance of Terms and Conditions as per Annexure 4.
6. The Bidder must not be blacklisted/banned/suspended or have a record of any service-related dispute with any organization in India or elsewhere. A declaration to this effect to be provided as per Annexure 3.

Section 3 – Terms and Conditions

A) Submission of Tender:

1. All documentation in the tender should be in English.
2. Tender should be submitted in two envelopes (two-bid system).
 - a. Technical Bid (Part-A) – Technical bid consisting of all technical details and checklist for conformance to technical specifications. The proposal should contain a compliance table with **4 columns** in addition to the ones in the technical requirements table that has been included with this RFQ below. The compliance table should include all the items in the same order and format. The first column should describe your compliance in a “Yes” or “No” response. If “No” the second column should state the extent of deviation. The “third” column should state the reasons for the deviation, if any. The fourth column can be used to compare your tool with that of your competitors or provide details as requested in the technical requirements table below. (Suppliers who include any indication of prices in the technical bid will be automatically disqualified).
 - b. Commercial Bid (Part-B) – Indicating item-wise price for the items mentioned in the technical bid, as per the format of quotation provided in the tender, and other commercial terms and conditions.
 - c. The technical proposal should contain a **technical compliance table with 4 columns**. The first column must list the technical requirements and other requirements, in the order that they are mentioned below. The second column should provide specifications of the instrument against the requirement (please provide quantitative responses wherever possible). The third column should describe your compliance with a “Yes” or “No” only. Ensure that the entries in column 2 and column 3 are consistent. The fourth column can contain additional remarks. You can use this opportunity to highlight technical features, qualify responses of previous columns, or provide additional details.
3. The technical bid and price bid should each be placed in separate sealed covers, superscripting on both the envelopes the tender no. and the due date. Both these sealed covers are to be placed in a bigger cover, which should also be sealed and duly superscripted with the Tender No, Tender Description & Due Date.
4. The SEALED COVER superscribing the tender number and the due date should reach **CST Room 204, Centre for Sustainable Technologies (near FSID), Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru – 560012, India** on or before the due date mentioned in the tender notice. In case the due date happens to be holiday, the tender will be accepted and opened on the next working day. If the quotation cover is not sealed, it will be rejected.
5. All queries are to be addressed to the contact provided in “Section 1 – Bid Schedule” of the tender notice.
6. GST/other taxes, levies etc., are to be indicated separately. The BIDDER should mention GST Registration and PAN in the tender document (Indian Bidders only).
7. If the price is not quoted in the Commercial Bid as per the format provided in the tender document the bid is liable to be rejected.
8. The Institute reserves the right to accept or reject any bid and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids at any time prior to the award of contract, without there by incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders or any obligation to inform the affected bidder or bidders.

9. Incomplete bids will be summarily rejected.
10. The quote should come only from an Indian Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) or an authorized distributor in India.
11. The quotations should be on FOR-IISc Bangalore basis in INR only.
12. Bidders offering imported products will fall under the category of non-local suppliers.

The bidders cannot claim themselves as Class-1 local suppliers/Class-2 local suppliers by claiming services such as transportation, insurance, installation, commissioning, training, and other sales service support like AMC/CMC, etc., as local value addition.

13. MSMEs may seek exemption to some qualification criteria (as per GoI, only Micro and Small are eligible). IISc follows GFR2017 for such details.

B) Cancellation of Tender:

Notwithstanding anything specified in this tender document, IISc, in its sole discretion, unconditionally and without having to assign any reason, reserves the rights:

- a. To accept OR reject the lowest tender or any other tender or all the tenders.
- b. To accept any tender in full or in part.
- c. To reject the tender, offer not conforming to the tender terms.

C) Validity of the Offer:

The offer shall be valid for 90 Days from the date of opening of the commercial bid.

D) Evaluation of Offer:

1. The technical bid (Part A) will be opened first and evaluated.
2. Bidders meeting the required eligibility criteria as stated in Section 2 of this document shall only be considered for the Commercial Bid (Part B) opening. Further, agencies not furnishing the documentary evidence as required will not be considered.
3. Pre-qualification of the bidders shall not imply final acceptance of the Commercial Bid. The agency may be rejected at any point during technical evaluation or during commercial evaluation. The decision with regards acceptance and/or rejection of any offer in part or in full shall be the sole discretion of IISc, and the decision in this regard shall be binding on the bidders.
4. Award of contract will be subject to acceptance of terms and conditions stated in this tender.
5. Any offer that deviates from the vital conditions (as illustrated below) of the tender is liable to be rejected:
 - a. Non-submission of complete offers.
 - b. Receipt of bids after the due date and time, and or by email/fax (unless specified otherwise).
 - c. Receipt of bids in open conditions.
6. In case any BIDDER is silent on any clauses mentioned in these tender documents, IISc Bangalore shall construe that the BIDDER had accepted the clauses as of the tender, and no further claim will be entertained.
7. No revision in the terms and conditions quoted in the offer will be entertained after the last date and time fixed for receipt of tenders.
8. Lowest bid will be calculated based on the total price of all items tendered for Basic equipment, along with accessories selected for installation, operation, preprocessing and post-processing, optional items, recommended spares, warranty, annual maintenance contract.

E) Pre-requisites:

The bidder will provide the prerequisite installation requirements of the equipment along with the technical bid.

F) Warranty:

The complete system is to be under a warranty period of a minimum of **3 years**, including free supply of consumables, spare parts, and data analysis software from the date of functional installation. If the instrument is found to be defective, it must be replaced or **rectified at the cost of the bidder within 7 days** from the date of receipt of written communications from IISc, Bangalore. If there is any delay in replacement or rectification, the warranty period should be correspondingly extended.

G) Annual Maintenance Contract:

An annual maintenance contract (AMC) for 3 years post-warranty, towards maintenance and/or service, should be provided on completion of the warranty period. All compatible parts/spares, existing or upgraded, for the supplied equipment, must be available for at least 10 years from the date of commissioning the equipment. The AMC rate must be mentioned as an optional item in the financial bid.

H) Purchase Order:

1. The order will be placed on the bidder whose bid is accepted by IISc based on the terms and conditions mentioned in the tender document.
2. The quantity of the items in the tender is only indicative. IISc reserves the right to modify the quantity of the items depending on the requirement.
3. If the quality of the product and service provided is unsatisfactory, IISc reserves the right to cancel or amend the contract.

I) Delivery, Installation, and Training:

The bidder shall provide the lead time to deliver and commission the equipment at IISc from the date of receipt of the purchase order. **Shipment of the equipment, delivery, unloading, and commissioning is within the scope of the successful bidder.** The system should be **delivered, commissioned, and made functional within 60 days (2 months) from the date of receipt of the purchase order.** The supply of the items will be considered as effective only on satisfactory installation and inspection of the system, and inspection of all the items and features/capabilities tested by IISc. After successful installation and inspection, the date of taking over the entire equipment set-up by IISc shall be taken as the start date of the warranty period. Partial shipment will not be permitted/accepted.

Once successfully commissioned, the bidder should arrange for the demonstration and technical training towards operating and maintaining the equipment for the personal identified by IISc.

J) Payment Terms:

The payment will be through bank transfer after successful delivery, installation and training.

K) Statutory Variation:

Any statutory increase in the taxes and duties after the bidder's offer, if it takes place within the original contractual delivery date, will be borne by IISc subject to the claim being supported by documentary evidence. However, if any decrease takes place, the advantage will have to be passed on to IISc.

L) Disputes and Jurisdiction:

Any legal disputes arising out of any breach of contract pertaining to this tender shall be settled in the court of competent jurisdiction located within the city of Bengaluru, India.

M) General:

1. All amendments, time extensions, clarifications, etc., within the period of submission of the tender will be communicated electronically. No extension in the bid due date/time shall be considered on account of delay in receipt of any document(s) by mail.
2. The bidder may furnish any additional information that is necessary to establish capabilities to complete the envisaged work. It is, however, advised not to furnish superfluous information.
3. The bidder may visit the installation site before submission of the tender, with prior intimation.
4. All imported equipment should be quoted in the currency of the country of origin, and all locally sourced items should be quoted in **Indian Rupees (INR)**.
5. Any information furnished by the bidder found to be incorrect, either immediately or at a later date, would render the bidder liable to be debarred from tendering/taking up work at IISc.
6. **The selected vendor must register with IISc (free registration) before tender submission if not already registered. The vendor code shall be mentioned in the quotation. Section 4 – Technical Specifications

Thermal Properties Analyzer

General Description and Equipment: The Thermal Properties Analyzer (TPA) will permit thermal conductivity testing of a wide range of solids, liquids, powders and pastes/gels. Adopting transient plane, line and wire source sensors, the TPA will permit measurement of Thermal Diffusivity, Thermal Effusivity and Specific Heat Capacity of applicable materials, including anisotropic, under ambient and varying temperature and humidity conditions maintained in an environmental control chamber. The TPA will be equipped with a data acquisition system interfaced with a laptop/PC. The sensors, if interchangeable, should feature a plug and play compatibility with the data acquisition system. The sensor performance and measurements to comply with ISO 22007-2, GB/T 32064, IEEE 442, ASTM: D5930, D7984, D5930, D7896, D5334. Any other compliance may be specifically highlighted.

The equipment to feature a combination of sensors providing measurement parameters equal to or better than the following ranges:

- Thermal Conductivity Range: 0.1 to 1800 W/mK
- Heat Capacity Range: 0.1 to 5 MJ/m²K
- Thermal Effusivity Range: 5 to 40,000 Ws^{1/2}/m²K
- Thermal Diffusivity Range: 0.01 to up to 1200 mm²/s
- Measurement precision: better than 3% for solids, semi-solids and powders; better (lower) than 4% for liquids
- Measurement accuracy: better (lower) than 6%

The application is to measure thermal properties of solid, semi-solids, gels, liquids, powders, polymer melts, metals, cement, composites, ceramics, polymers, rubber, nanomaterials, aerogels, phase change materials, etc., adopted in applications pertaining to buildings, automobiles, thermal insulations, batteries, aerospace, geology, nuclear, thermoelectric, thin films, explosives, space, etc.
